HAMDICAP CHAIRMAN REPORT— DICK KINER

PLGA JOINS USGA ELECTRONIC HANDICAPPING SYSTEM

After one full year of discussion, investigation, research, interviews, and due diligence, the PLGA Board of Directors has voted unanimously to secure its Electronic Handicapping System software services from GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network) at the expiration of its contract with IDC (Integrated Data Company).

GHIN, is the largest electronic handicapping system software provider in the United States, it is a non-profit arm of the United States Golf Association (USGA). Its sole focus is the delivery of the USGA Handicap System to USGA licensed state / regional golf associations. Because it need not, indeed cannot, report net profits, it is able to reinvest all of its resources in the research & development necessary to maintain delivery of those services on the technological cutting edge.

The benefits of changing to GHIN include but are hardly limited to the following features:

- * The extension of the Revision period to the last day of each month, e.g., scores posted the last day of a month become part of the next day's monthly revision;
- * The capacity to Revise Indexes twice per month on the 1st and 15th at no added cost to the clubs;
- * The capacity to add a member or perform any other membership maintenance function and see such additions or changes reflected the next day throughout the electronic system, i.e., join today and post tomorrow – no more waiting for the next Revision;
- * The full integration of the various posting and maintenance portals, i.e., on-course computers, online posting, home computers, etc;
- * The capacity to access TPP, the USGA's proprietary tournament program, designed by the conductors of the world's greatest golf championships to be uniquely suited to the needs of tournament chairs and fully compatible with the GHIN membership database;
- * One size fits all – services and platforms are identical for all GHIN associations, making seamless national access, connection and integration readily available to PLGA;
- * All of the above (and more) at lower costs.

This announcement will be followed in short and steady course by more detailed information about the new system, the rollout of the changeover, the timetable for completion, etc. In addition PLGA and a team from GHIN / USGA will be on the ground here in Southern California performing software installations, training clubs, and conducting educational seminars. By the time the switch is pulled, all member clubs will be well versed in this new, cutting-edge technological environment. The membership identifier system in the new environment will change. IDC uses a 6-digit numbering system, GHIN employs a 7-digit system in deference to the fact that there are in excess of one million GHIN members in the United States. Does this mean that all PLGA members will need to be issued new numbers? Not necessarily. The PLGA anticipates that for approximately 95% of the membership, we will be able to simply place the same integer either just in front or just in back of everyone's extant 6-digit IDC number. This is the protocol that was followed in the early 1990's when the Northern California Golf Association (NCGA), the largest golf association in the nation, made this same switch from IDC to GHIN. All GHIN members in Northern California have a number that begins with "9." No more than 5% of the membership should have to grapple with the issuance of completely new numbers.

While PLGA was the first of Southern California's USGA licensed associations to make the decision, All of the region's other allied associations have followed suit. Southern California's electronic handicapping system will not only return to its previous seamless nature with respect to the lack of differentiation among associations, it will enter an era in which Southern California is no longer on an island with respect to the rest of the nation's state / regional golf associations, particularly Northern California. "The process of creating a seamless connection among the USGA licensed golf associations here in Southern California, as well as a seamless connection with the vast majority of USGA licensed golf associations in the country will make it easy for member to post away scores anywhere in the USA
